Up2U Litter Bags Now Available Coastwide Through Adopt-A-Beach

Texas Adopt-A-Beach coordinators have a new tool to share with volunteers this year - the Up2U litter bag. Originally launched in 2004 by the Nueces River Authority in the upper Nueces River watershed, the Up2U Litter Prevention Program was created to tackle litter problems on the Frio and Nueces Rivers and to remove trash and harmful debris before it could harm fish and wildlife. The program was an immediate success, and its signature yellow mesh bags, printed with the empowering "Up2U" message, quickly became a symbol of personal responsibility for keeping waterways clean.

Building on that success, in 2020 the Coastal Bend Bays & Estuaries Program (CBBEP) received funding from the Environmental Protection Agency to expand the program to the six coastal counties and ten watersheds of the Texas Coastal Bend. Over the past five years, CBBEP has built a strong network of partners and more than 40 distribution locations, delivering over 200,000 litter bags to residents, visitors, and community groups. The program has also supported countless volunteer-led cleanups, helping to prevent litter from entering waterways, safeguard wildlife, improve water quality, and enhance recreational spaces.

Now, through a new partnership between Texas Adopt-A-Beach and the Up2U program, these litter bags will be available to site coordinators and volunteers at cleanup sites across the entire Texas coast. Lightweight and easy to handle - even in coastal winds - the bags are simple for volunteers of all ages to manage and fill. The bags also include the QR code to the Clean Swell App so all trash can be easily recorded.

Beyond cleanup events, volunteers are encouraged to take a bag home for future use or look for existing Up2U distribution stations along the coast. Because the bags are reusable and recyclable, they can easily be carried on walks, taken fishing,

or used on a day at the beach. This helps reinforce the idea that prevention is just as important as cleanup.

Together, Adopt-A-Beach and Up2U are creating a stronger, coastwide effort to reduce litter at its source by putting this simple but powerful tool into the hands of thousands of Texans and visitors who care about our rivers, bays, and beaches.

Spring Cleanup Recap!

The Texas General Land Office's Adopt-A-Beach Spring Coastwide Cleanup and 2025 Texas Coastal Roundup were immensely successful for the South Padre Island community and across the Texas coast. Both events took place on Saturday, April 26, 2025 and included thousands of volunteers and attendees.

"As a proud Texan who spent over a decade living on our coast, I am thrilled to be able to give back to our beautiful beaches and coastal communities through the GLO's Texas Coastal Roundup and Adopt-A-Beach Coastwide Spring Cleanup," said Commissioner Buckingham. "Nearly 5,000 Adopt-A-Beach volunteers across the coast rolled up their sleeves and got to work, removing more than 53,000 pounds of trash. Later that day, at the Texas Coastal Roundup, the GLO and more than 30 coastal organizations from around South Texas joined forces to educate hundreds of attendees about our work to protect the coast and those who call it home. I want to thank all the wonderful sponsors who helped make these crucial events possible. Together, Texans will safeguard our coast for future generations to enjoy."

Across the 21 locations along the coast, 4,958 Adopt-A-Beach volunteers removed an astounding 53,002 pounds of trash from Texas beaches on Saturday. During the 2025 Adopt-A-Beach Spring Coastwide Cleanup, volunteers also surpassed the significant milestone of cleaning more than 10,000 tons of trash from Texas beaches since the program started in 1986.
