Students

You are invited to submit a research essay on any topic in Texas history. It can be on any historical person, event, place, group, or cultural tradition, however big or small, that helped shape Texas. In the essay, students should demonstrate what makes their chosen subject historically significant and provide details.

Teachers

This is a great opportunity for your students to practice their research and writing skills, share finished work with classmates, and reinforce TEKS topics ahead of tests and assessments. We will also be providing teachers of the winning students with gift cards and other prizes.

Submissions will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- **Adherence** to guidelines and requirements
- **Originality**
- **Essay main idea** and use of supporting evidence
- **Writing** skills (spelling, grammar, punctuation, etc.)

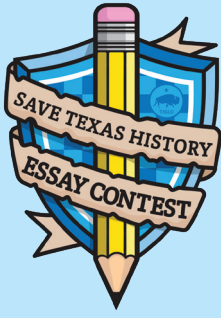

Guidelines and Requirements

4th Grade

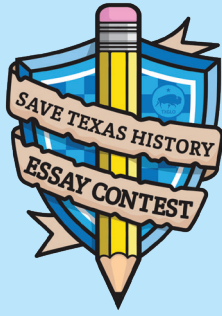
- Only fourth-grade public, private, or homeschooled students residing in Texas are eligible
- Must be on a Texas history topic (any subject)
- **400 – 500 words** (not including bibliography)
- Typed or handwritten essay format
- Must include an original title
- Bibliography as separate page required
- Must include a cover page with student's name and school. Student's name must not appear on any of the following essay pages
- Must be in Word or similar (not PDF)
- Must be student's original work. Plagiarized material is not permitted. This includes copying and pasting words from books, websites, or other sources, and/or someone other than the student writing the essay, including artificial intelligence (AI).
- Essay must be accompanied by a completed and signed permission form (both guardian and student must sign)
- Contestants are strongly encouraged to review the essay contest rubric before submission

7th Grade

- Only seventh-grade public, private, or homeschooled students residing in Texas are eligible
- Must be on a Texas history topic (any subject)
- **750 – 1,000 words** (not including bibliography)
- Typed (not handwritten) essay format
- Must include an original title
- Bibliography as separate page required
- Must include a cover page with student's name and school. Student's name must not appear on any of the following essay pages
- Must be in Word or similar (not PDF)
- Must be student's original work. Plagiarized material is not permitted. This includes copying and pasting words from books, websites, or other sources, and/or someone other than the student writing the essay, including artificial intelligence (AI).
- Essay must be accompanied by a completed and signed permission form (both guardian and student must sign)
- Contestants are strongly encouraged to review the essay contest rubric before submission

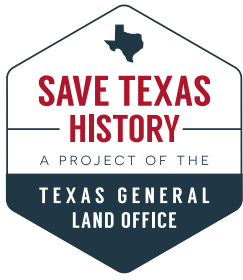

Contest Rubric

	WEAK	STRONGER	STRONGEST
MAIN IDEA OR ARGUMENT (Sentence that addresses what is historically significant about the essay topic)	Main idea or argument of the essay is nonexistent, unclear, or the topic is too broad or vague.	Main idea or argument of the essay is clear, but not as tightly focused on the essay topic as it could be throughout the essay.	Main idea or argument of the essay is clearly stated in the first paragraph, remains focused throughout the supporting paragraphs, and is emphasized again in the concluding paragraph.
USE OF EVIDENCE (Details/facts that support the main idea)	Insufficient evidence of what makes the subject historically significant, OR essay has an excessive amount of evidence that is not supporting a main idea (i.e. information dump). Evidence is not grouped thematically into supporting paragraphs.	Some factually correct evidence is provided which shows why the topic is historically significant, but paragraphs tend to be repetitive (i.e. not thematically distinct from each other).	Each supporting paragraph provides factually correct evidence that supports a main idea and explores a different reason the topic is historically significant.
WRITING MECHANICS (Correct spelling, punctuation, capitalization, sentence structure, etc.)	Essay has a lot of mistakes, such as typos, misspellings, sentence fragments or run-ons, punctuation or capitalization errors, or other grammar issues.	Essay has occasional mistakes, such as typos, misspellings, sentence fragments or run-ons, punctuation or capitalization errors, or other grammar issues.	Essay has very few or no mistakes, such as typos, misspellings, sentence fragments or run-ons, punctuation or capitalization errors, or other grammar issues.
SOURCES/ BIBLIOGRAPHY	Essay includes fewer than three sources on the bibliography page, and/or uses Wikipedia as a source.	Essay uses at least three (4th grade) or four (7th grade) sources, none of which are from Wikipedia.	Essay uses at least four (4th grade) or five (7th grade) sources, none of which are from Wikipedia.
