2021 Winter Storms: HUD MID Counties Program


The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) allocated **\$43,632,000** in Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funding to the State of Texas in response to the 2021 Winter Storms (DR-4586). HUD designated all 254 counties in Texas as eligible for the grant, but designated Dallas, Harris, and Tarrant Counties as most impacted, or “HUD MID Counties”. HUD requires **80% (\$34,905,600)** of the funds to be directed to the HUD MID Counties.

Program Overview

The 2021 Winter Storm HUD MID Counties program will provide funds for affordable multifamily housing and infrastructure projects in Dallas, Harris, and Tarrant Counties.

Eligible Project Types

- Affordable multifamily housing projects
- Infrastructure improvements
- Communications infrastructure
- Public facilities
- Fire protection facilities or equipment
- Emergency power generators
- Public services
- Cost share for CDBG-DR eligible projects



How will the HUD MID Counties program work?

Each of the three HUD MID Counties will receive up to \$10,153,000 for eligible projects. Dallas, Harris, and Tarrant Counties will select eligible projects and submit applications to the GLO. The GLO will review the applications to confirm the projects meet HUD eligibility requirements.
