The Coastal Bend Bays Foundation greatly appreciates Texas General Land Office Coastal Management Program grant for helping sponsor our Eleventh Annual Earth Day-Bay Day (EDBD) Celebration in the Coastal Bend. The event took place on Saturday, April 17, 2010, at Cole Park in Corpus Christi, Texas. The event is one of the most popular spring festivals in the Coastal Bend which is free to the public and brings families, particularly children and youth, outdoors.

The festival featured ~80 exhibitors and vendors represented primarily by non-profit organizations which support, teach, sponsor or deal with conserving our natural habitats or resources, use of green technologies, and promote benefits of recycling as well as other products which help in the ecological health in our communities.

Visitors attending the 10 am to 5 pm event were estimated at six thousand based on surveys taken by our volunteers. We feel this was a great show of support because the occurrence of thunder storms before the event, and the forecast of heavy thunderstorms and a tornado warning the day of the event. We did experience a short, mild shower during event but no severe weather occurred at the site. Exit surveys of participants taken by our volunteers support an overwhelming satisfaction of the exhibits and activities experienced at the festival.

#### **Monthly Grant Report**

Task 1: Establish and Coordinate Event Steering Committee and Develop Event Implementation Strategies.

• Status of the task during this reporting period: [] in progress [X] completed: The event/festival was completed April 17, 2010.

• Major Accomplishments: The steering committee met from January through April as did the Volunteer committee prior to the event of April 17. Discussions and actions covered all aspects, plans and preparations for the event, logistics, setup, security, off-site transportation, setup and break down times, posters and sign printing and placements, and many other tasks, functions and plans for the event for April 17, 2010.

• The committee printed a total of 6,000 posters and distributed them throughout the Coastal Bend Area as part of their outreach efforts, including publicizing EDBD at community events and other city and area wide-meeting and functions.

• Identification of Problems: None.

• Plans for Next Reporting Period: The CBBF committees met April 28 for a post evaluation review. Both positive and negative feedback was received regarding the success of the event (overall was very good), logistic concerns (parking issues and location of the event), and discussed next year's event. No scheduled meetings until January 2011 are planned for 2011 event.

# Task 2: Develop Sponsorship and Vendor Packets/Solicit Sponsorships and Vendors/Recruit Exhibitors

- Status of the task during this reporting period: [] in progress [X] completed: We continued to accept & recruiting vendors, exhibitors and sponsors through until April 12 when applications were closed. Exhibitors totaled 67 booths plus 12 other vendors (for profit). This task is complete for this year.
- Major Accomplishments: The CBBF had more than 79 booths and essentially filled the area designated for the festival/event. Even though with threatening thunderstorms before and during the event, and a short shower, no exhibitor, or vendor left the event but instead stayed throughout the entire time (9am to 5 pm). Sponsors solicited for donations contributed a total of \$14,200. Please see the attached Financial Break-down report on this event including sponsors and expenditures.
- Identification of Problems and Obstacles: None.
- Plans for Next Reporting Period: Schedule for Event completed.

Task 3: Secure Media Commitments, including purchases and donations, and coordinate Media.

- Status of the task during this reporting period: [] in progress [X] completed: The 2010 Earth Day Bay Day Celebration was completed as planned.
- Major Accomplishments: Eight Media organizations/outlets were contracted to begin advertising by radio, newspaper and TV two weeks prior to the Earth Day Bay Celebration event and up to the event itself. Channel 3 News covered the event and the local newspaper, the Corpus Christi Caller Times, interviewed CBBF staff at the event. The Caller Times also featured the event in the 'Local Column' Section both on Saturday and Sunday of the event weekend of Earth Day- Bay Day.
- 2010. Identification of Problems and Obstacles: We had thunder storms two to three
  days prior to the event and heavy thunderstorms forecast for the event. However, even
  though we had 20 minutes of light shower during the event and a Tornado Warning
  (tornado sighted in the area) issued, the weather held well enough for the event site
  during the whole day for a an event filled with much family fun and community
  participation.
- Plans for Next Reporting Period: This task is complete.

#### Task 4: Recruit and Coordinate Volunteers.

- Status of the task during this reporting period: [] in progress [X] completed: CBBF sought and advertised for volunteers throughout the months, weeks and days prior to the event. CBBF feels successful in recruiting ~75 volunteers for the day of the event. A grant from The Trull Foundation helped fund "Volunteer" vests and also provided funding to serve breakfast and a light lunch during the day of the event. A large number of the volunteers for the event date were university students who helped in all aspects including parking assistance, distributing brochures, posters, setting up signs, directing the information booth, set up and break down of the tables and chairs, assisting seniors, helping with the KidFish Tank and many other tasks.
- Major Accomplishments: We were able to recruit sufficient volunteers to meet the many functions and tasks necessary to have a successful event.
- Identification of Problems and Obstacles: None.
- Plans for Next Reporting Period: No further tasks are planned until 2011.

# Task 5: Secure and Contract for Coastal Expo, event site, event security, portable toilets transportation, and other event needs such as tables, tents, trash cans, and dumpsters.

- Status of the task during this reporting period: [] in progress [X] completed: The event occurred at Cole Park, in Corpus Christi, as threatening thunder storms passed through the area. Security was contracted and service began a noon on Friday prior to the event. The tent contractors (2) setup their equipment by Friday evening and stacked the table and chairs for distribution on the day of the event. All of the additional equipment and necessary suppliers for these equipment needs were placed and satisfactorily provided. One or two complaints were voiced regarding the time cycle for shuttle service which brought visitors from the off-site parking but otherwise well served. Portable toilets, water stations and other amenities were secured and provided as planned.
- Major Accomplishments: Secured site location, worked on logistics with several city departments, Secured security for Friday through Saturday (day of the event), as well as

- other logistical items, including recycling bins and trash ca Secured site location, worked on logistics with several city departments, Secured security for Friday through Saturday (day of the event), as well as other logistical items, including recycling bins and trash cans throughout the event.
- Identification of Problems and Obstacles: Three days prior to the event, the two tent
  contractors reported that they could not get the equipment setup as planned due to other
  contracted events in the area and wanted to setup the tents two to three days prior to the
  event. We found that unsatisfactory (would have increased our security costs) and were
  finally able to secure the agreed schedule (setup the night before the event).
- Plans for Next Reporting Period: None until 2011.

#### Task 6: Stage/Host/Coordinate the Event on April 17, 2010

- Status of the task during this reporting period: [] in progress [x] completed: This event is complete for 2010.
- Major Accomplishments: The Earth Day-Bay Day Celebration event happened as planned on a very stormy day. Threatening thunder storms that passed through the area before, during and after the event did not stop the event from being a big success. Based on interviews of participants, the annual Earth Day Bay Day continues to be a very popular event to Coastal Bend residents. Attendance was estimated at near 6000 visitors based on volunteer counters. The tent contractors (2) setup their equipment by Friday evening and stacked tables and chairs for distribution on the day of the event. All of the additional equipment and necessary suppliers for equipment and services were satisfactorily provided. Two complaints were voiced regarding the time cycle for shuttle service which brought visitors from the off-site parking but the service was otherwise adequate.

About 90 volunteers assisted in many of the functions which helped the success of the festival and its smooth operation under damp weather conditions. Services acquired such as advertising for the event, additional event posters printed and distributed, portable toilets, water stations and other amenities were secured and provided as planned. A food vendor, solicited from a local church, was a plus this year providing small menu of meals to this year's visitors. Constructive comments by some of the non-profits regarding placement of booths in next year's event to maximize the crowds visiting their booths were received and considered for the 2011 event. The majority of the visitors were families with children. The event also maximized its community presence by partnering with two separate events that day - Youth Odyssey, a local non-profit helping low income families, which sponsored a short marathon with activity stations for youth; and the Sierra Club which sponsored a bicycle ride from TAMU-CC that morning to the festival arriving at the opening of the festival.

The event featured exhibits ranging from eco-green messages from

recycling/reuse/minimizing waste, wildlife, marine and habitat conservation, pollution abatement, ground water contamination, protecting local resources, eco-energy exhibits, and many more. Many of the local conservation groups, city and county agencies, and federal agencies also participated in exhibits that brought these topics and education aides to adults but also to children and youth who comprised the majority of the visitors to Earth Day Bay Day in the Coastal Bend. These included but were not limited to organizations such as the Coastal Bend Audubon Club, the Sierra Club, City of Corpus Christi (CC) Water Dept., CC Stormwater Dept., CC Waterwater Dept., US Fish and Wildlife Service, Nueces County Park, Nueces River Authority, Coastal Bend Bays & Estuaries Program, Coastal Bend Master Naturalists, other eco-based exhibits, and many others.

Entertainment included several musical groups, a variety of dance troupes, stewardship presentations by the Honorary Chairman (Billy Sandifer), and special exhibits such as the Texas Coastal Expo with marine touch tanks and many hands-on activities, the KidFish Foundation fishing tank, several rides such as the Orbitron, and a scaling wall for youth among many of the exhibits.

Based on exit interviews, visitors participating in Earth Day Bay Day Celebration 2010 were overwhelmingly satisfied in their experience at this festival.

Crab Marsh (110 sq. ft.)

Touch and learn about fiddler crabs, hermit crabs, and blue crabs at our crab-shaped pool. The crab marsh has sand and local marsh plants that create a "true" habitat for the visiting crabs. Children and adults will learn about where the crabs live, what the crabs eat, what eats the crab, the importance of marsh habitat, and why we should care about their habitat.

Tables/Chairs- 2 chairs

Glass-bottom Stream (55 sq. ft.)

A V-shaped, glass trough is filled with water, rocks, and native aquatic plants to replicate the structure of a natural stream. The glass-bottom allows visitors to see the 3-D picture of a stream and how fish and invertebrates can "hide" from predators. The stream demonstrates the importance of habitat, and how aquatic insects act as water quality indicators. Ever wonder about the quality of your local stream? Now you will be able to tell just by looking at the insects!

- Tables/Chairs-1 table, 2 chairs
- Electricity
- Water-just need to initially fill it.

Mystery Fish Kill Game (102 sq. ft.)

3

Become an honorary member of the Kills and Spills Team by solving the mysterious fish kill, just like a TPWD biologist! Real clues, pictures, and facts are used to help teach how fish kills can be caused by natural conditions and/or human contamination. The circumstances of the fish kill and the clues are used to communicate about the physical and biological characteristics of coastal ecosystems. Each participant is rewarded with a Kills and Spills Team sticker.






